What is the STARFLEET Special Operations? Cadet Program

We take pride in our children and like wise want to share with them all of out positive experiences. With that we have established a Cadet Program for our Chapter.

Children of all ages are welcomed at any event or meeting with the exception of closed door executive meetings. Exceptions to that rule can be made as well.

We have established three (3) levels to our Cadet Program. They are as follows:

Birth thru 5 will be in the Apprentice Program.

6 thru 9 will be in the Junior Program.

10 thru 15 will be in the Cadet Program.

16 and up may choose to follow the Adult Program.

The Chief of Cadets is directly involved with the Cadets and reports directly to the CO and XO.

Cadet's will have an Awards Program for school attendance and scholastic achievements that will directly result in their promotion thru the Chapter.

We will also encourage our cadets to provide community service and other volunteer services.

Any Cadet may take OTS at any point in their life and once they reach 16 they will receive full promotions to the Officer Grade that they qualify for. While in the Cadet Program, Officer grades are issued as brevetted ranks.

Chain of Command

While we are not a military organization we do follow a Chain of Command. We do this so that it can facilitate the repair of any problems and gives authority to elected individuals to fix any problems that may arise.

Your first step in the Chain of Command will be your Department Head. The Department Head should be able to address many of your immediate issues.

Second step in the Chain of Command your Division Head, if there is no Division Head please follow the next link in the Chain of Command

The Third step is your Second Officer, this member is in the Command Staff and will in most cases be able to address any problems.

The Fourth step is your Executive Officer, Chapter Vice-President, this member is the second in command and will address your problems immediately.

The final step in you local Chain of Command is the Commanding Officer, Chapter President, at most instances this step will also include the Executive Committee.

Out side of the chapter you may go to the Regional Coordinator who may direct you further up the chain if needed.

Marines aboard this Chapter also have a Chain of Command that follows similar steps but they will start up the Marine Chain of Command to the Battalion OIC, Brigade OIC, etc.. once exhausting local resources.

Departments

Command -

The Command Department is made up of the senior officers of the ship/chapter: The Commanding Officer, Executive Officer, Second Officer and Third Officer. The Chief and Assistant Chief of the Junior Officers, the Chief and Assistant Chief of Ships Services, the Executive Chef and Chef, the Judge and Vice Judge Advocate General as well as the Yeoman.

The Command Department is primarily responsible for conducting the meetings, reviewing the membership rolls for promotions, awards and overseeing the unit activities either directly or by appropriate delegation.

Operations -

The Operations Department is primarily responsible for activity planning and away missions. The Division also coordinates all unit activities with the ship sections to ensure smooth ship operations.

The Communications Department is primarily responsible for the publishing of the unit newsletter and keeping the unit members notified of upcoming events, though all the Departments may also be involved in this.

The Engineering Department is primarily responsible for coordinating transportation requirements for away missions. The Department also develops schematics and upgrade recommendations for ship upgrades and servicing.

The Security Department is primarily responsible for training new cadets to become full commissioned officers, ship's listserve, database and Treasury. The Department also develops training programs for all unit activities and provides helpful information on Security issues.

Departments

Sciences -

The Science Department is responsible for Charities and providing articles on Science both fiction and non-fiction.

The Medical Department may be involved in real Medical concerns such as keeping track of the medical conditions of the crew for referral in a medical crisis. It may involve training in CPR or other medically related matters. It may involve writing articles for newsletters pertaining to the real medical field.

Marine Strike Group -

Our MSG is a Medical Unit with various roles within our unit. We are part of the First Marine Division, First Brigade, Eighth Battalion.

STARFLEET Special Operations Unit -

Our SFSO unit is an Intelligence Unit a Specialized Division in STARFLEET. We specialize in covert intelligence gathering and gather all-source intelligence to assess threads and make recommendations to the SFSO Command.
